In special session this day, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, assembled in the chambers of said Commissioners with all the members of the Board and the County Clerk present.

Discussion was given to the issuance of bonds for the relief of the poor, and after thoroughly considering the matter, the Board passed the following resolution:

RESOLUTION FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS FOR THE RELIEF OF THE POCR AS FROVIDED IN CHAPTER 244, LEGISLATIVE SESSION OF 1937

WHEREAS, it appears to the Board thay additional revenue will be needed for relief of the poor and destitute of the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, and that the funds on hands for said purpose will be inadequate for the care of the poor and destitute.

WHEREAS, the County of Douglas had for the year preceding an assessed valuation of \$35,397,980 and whereas under Chapter 244 Session Laws of 1937, it is provided that the County may issue bonds for the relief of the poor not exceeding one-third of one per cent of assessed valuation.

HOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County in a special session this 20th day of September, 1957, that pursuant to Chapter 244 of the Session Laws of 1937, the County of Douglas issue bonds in the sum not to exceed \$15,000.00 the same to mature in equal amounts each year for a period not exceeding ten years, the said County to annually make a levy covering the interest accruing and the bonds maturing during the next budget year, and that this proposal to issue bonds be submitted to the State Tax Commission of the State of Kansas for their approval.
