

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

October 6, 1937.

The Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all the Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

Again, bills for wages, materials and for the maintenance of the Destitute were presented, examined and ordered paid according to the Allowance Record.

Raymond Rice, Attorney for K.E.P. Company was in for a short conference with the Board and the County Attorney.

The County Auditor with Mr. and Mrs. John A. Netsker discussed with the Commissioners the setting up of the new purchase and order system at the County Farm.

M. A. Gorrill again appeared before the Board and County Attorney for the final decision on the compromising of taxes for Graeber Bros. The Board adopted the following resolution:

RESOLUTION PASSED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS, AT A REGULAR ADJOURNED MEETING HELD ON OCTOBER 6, 1937.

WHEREAS, the matter of an offer to compromise a personal property tax judgments made by Carl Graeber, individually, and Carl Graeber as administrator of the partnership estate of G. A. Graeber, deceased, Albert Graeber and Carl Graeber surviving partners came on for consideration before the Board of County Commissioners there being present Earl Black, member, James Brass, member and Chris Schaeke, Chairman of the Board also T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk and Chas. A. Springer, County Attorney, and

THEREUPON the said Board after considering said written application to compromise said personal property tax judgments against Carl Graeber and Graeber Brothers as evidenced by tax warrants numbers set out in said application which said warrants have been filed in the office of the Clerk of the District Court of Douglas County, Kansas, and are now a tax lien judgments and after being duly advised in the premises and the said Board acting under their general powers to manage and control the affairs of the County of Douglas, find that it would be to the best interest of Douglas County to compromise the total amount due on said tax lien judgments as evidenced by said warrants including all costs and accrued interest to date for the total sum of \$400, the same being the amount offered by the said applicants in full settlement of said personal property tax lien judgments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that the offer to compromise said tax lien judgments above described be and is hereby accepted and it is by the Board of County Commissioners ordered that the Clerk of the District Court of Douglas County, Kansas, receive the sum of \$400 in full satisfaction of the tax judgments together with all costs and interest, as appears on his docket against Carl Graeber and Graeber Brothers as evidenced by tax warrants numbered 3253, 3254, 328, 302, 323, 1352, 1677, 1678, 1679, 3030, 3230 and 4010 and that the said Clerk of the District Court satisfy said tax judgments in full upon the payment of said sum.

THEREUPON Commissioners James F. Brass moved the adoption of said resolution and all of the Commissioners voted "Aye".

James F. Brass moved that the County accept the \$400.00 as a compromise on the judgments held against Carl Graeber and Graeber Bros. by the County, for delinquent taxes. Motion seconded by Earl T. Black. On vote, all Commissioners voted in the affirmative.

The following resolution for an increase in the budget for Poor Relief was adopted:

RESOLUTION FOR INCREASING BUDGET FOR POOR RELIEF IN DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS

ADOPTED AT A REGULAR ADJOURNED MEETING HELD ON October 6, 1937.

WHEREAS, it appears to the Board of County Commissioners that additional revenue will be needed for relief of the poor and destitute of Douglas County and that the funds set up in the budget for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1937 will be inadequate, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners have applied to the State Tax Commission for authority to issue public assistance bonds in the sum not to exceed \$15,000.

WHEREAS, it is necessary the budget for the poor fund be increased in the sum of \$2000 and the budget for the public assistance funds be increased in the sum of \$10,000 and that a new budget be set up for the County Welfare fund in the amount of \$16,000.
