The Board of County Commissioners, having made application to the State Tax Commission for authority to issue not to exceed \$15,000 in bonds for the relief of the poor for Douglas County, a notice from the State Tax Commission has been received stating a hearing will be held at the office of the State Tax Commission on the 11th day of October, 1937, at 10 o'clock A. M.

In accordance with this notice, the Board of County Commissioners, Chairman Chris Schaake, Commissioners Earl T. Black and James F. Brass, County Clerk T. R. Gerhart, County Auditor, Mildred Le Suer, County Director Mildred D. Watson and County Attorney Charles A. Springer, appeared at the hearing and presented evidence for the need of the issue for poor relief bonds.

Whereupon, the State Tax Commission, issued an order granting the application for Douglas County to issue said bonds. The order follows:

## ORDER

Now on the 11th day of October, 1937, the above entitled matter comes on for hearing before the Tax Commission.

The Commission, after being fully advised in the premises finds, that the applicant taxing district gave notice of this hearing as required by the Commission, a copy of which notice, together with the proof of publication are filed herein and both of which are hereby approved.

The Commission further finds, that the statements and allegations contained in the application are true. That it will be necessary for the said applicant county to issue bonds as prayed for in order to provide sufficient funds for the relief of the poor and destitute of said county.

It is, Therefore, by the Commission, considered and ordered, that Douglas County, Kansas, be, and it hereby is authorized to issue bonds not to exceed the sum of \$15,000.00, during the current budget year, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 244 of the 1937 Session Laws, and the proceeds from such bonds shall be expended as provided by law.
