October 20, 1937.

The Board of County Commissioners, upon call of the Chairman, convened as a Board of Social Welfare in the Social Welfare Department to confer with the County Director and assistants on welfare cases.

During the meeting a motion was made appointing Mrs. Mildred D. Watson as cooperating representative for the National Association for Travelers' Aid and Transient Service. James F. Brass seconded the motion. On roll call, a affirmative vote carried said motion.

After completion of social welfare business, the Board adjourned to convene in special session as the Board of County Commissioners in the chambers of said commissioners.

The quarterly reports of the Sheriff and of the County Engineer were inspected and approved by the Board.

A road petition, signed by H. O. Wulfluhle and eleven others for the location of the following described road in Kanwaka Township, was presented to the Board by the County Clerk:

Beginning at the northeast corner of Sec. 5, T 13 S, R 13 E. Thence West on north line of said Sec. 5, one-half mile and terminating at the corner on the north line of Sec. 5, T 13 S, R 13 E.

The Board directed the County Clerk to publish a road notice in the official county paper for the viewing of said road on November 10, at 2 o'clock P. M., at the place of beginning.

The Register of Deeds, Harold A. Beck, informed the Board of the request made by Mr. Allen French, auditor, for the recording of the fidelity bonds of the county officials in the Register of Deeds office. If such procedure is to be carried out, he stressed the need of a book for the recording of said bonds.

Final disposition on purchase of a book was deferred until a later date.

Mr. Beck told the Commissioners that he is in almost immediate need of a new chattel index, and discussed with the Board the purchase of same.

After some discussion, the Board informed Mr. Beck to consult the County Clerk, Purchasing Agent for the County, and have the County Clerk order the record as specified by the Register of Deeds.

The County Engineer discussed several matters of road business with the Board.

The Board adjourned subject to the call of the Chairman or of the County Clerk.
