RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Douglas County, Kansas, is a county in Kansas having a population of more than 20,000 inhabitants, and

WHEREAS, University Drive, extending from the west line of West Campus Road to the west line of Strong Avenue,

is a public road in Douglas County, Kansas, lying entirely outside the limits of any incorporated city, and

WHEREAS, more than fifty per cent. of the property abutting upon the above described road is platted and laid out into lots and blocks, and

WHEREAS, a petition signed by the owners of more than sixty per cent. of the unplatted frontage on the above described road and by the owners of a sufficient percentage of the platted land abutting on said road to make more than fifty-one per cent. of the total frontage platted and unplatted has been filed, petitioning The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, to improve said road by the construction of a re-enforced concrete pavement 26 feet wide, including integral curb, together with the necessary grading and drainage, the cost thereof to be apportioned according to Section 68-728 of the General Statutes of Kansas for 1935, provided that federal funds can be obtained for the purpose of defraying a portion of the cost thereof,

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, deem it necessary to pave, curb, grade and drain said public road, as above described, and that the same be done, provided federal funds can be obtained for the purpose of defraying a portion of the cost thereof, and that the cost of such improvements, other than that paid by federal funds, be paid in the manner provided for in Section 68-728 of the General Statutes of Kansas for 1937, and

That this resolution be published for three consecutive weeks in the official paper of Douglas County, Kansas, according to law.

It was moved by Mr. Black and seconded by Mr. Schaake that the Resolutions be adopted. The motion was put, and the Resolutions adopted by unanimous vote.

A document covering the Proposal and Contract for Engineering Services of B. M. Babb, City Engineer, was presented, of which the following is a copy:-

PROPOSAL and CONTRACT for ENGINEERING SERVICES.

To the Hon. Board of County Commissioners,
Douglas County, Kansas.

Gentlemen:

I submit for your consideration the following proposition for ENGINEERING and SUPERVISION of CONSTRUCTION in connection with the construction of a W.P.A. Paving Project on the following streets or thoroughfares in or adjacent to West Hills, in Douglas County, Kansas: Emery Road, (all or a portion of Emery Road), University Drive, West Hills Parkway, and Stratford Road, or such portions of such streets or thoroughfares as may now or later be proposed for pavement under the W.P.A. Blanket Project to be provided.

The Engineering and Supervision services to be provided under this proposal are as follows:

1. To prepare a Blanket Project application to the W.P.A. covering all work likely to be proposed for construction in the West Hills district or adjacent thereto.
2. To prepare all detailed applications for detailed W.P.A. Projects under the Blanket Project.
3. To prepare complete detailed plans for any detailed project offered the W.P.A. under the Blanket Project.
4. To prepare complete and up-to-date specifications for construction and construction methods.
5. To provide all necessary estimates, both monthly and final, or as may otherwise be required.
6. To determine final costs, and properly subdivide them, and calculate all assessments.
7. To supervise the production of all coarse aggregates to be used in the work, and other aggregates produced locally.
8. To provide such additional engineer, or inspector, as the circumstances may require in order to provide adequate supervision of the work, and strict compliance with the specifications.
9. To perform all necessary testing of materials to be used in the construction work, except such tests as may require special and unusual equipment for accurate determination of results.
10. To keep strict account of all costs and expenditures from all sources affecting the project, so that the efficiency of the work may be determined at reasonable
