Mr. JOHN ANDERSON here appeared before the Board, seeking the job of Building a Trash Burner for use at the Court House.

Mr. Anderson was advised to talk with Mr. Trueblood, the County Engineer, who has the matter in charge.

The matter of Proposals for the AUDITING of the COUNTY OFFICES was here taken up.

Mr. Black moved the acceptance of the proposal of the Caton Auditing Company. Mr. Brass seconded, the Chairman put the motion, and by unanimous vote of the Board, it was so ordered.

The FINAL ABSTRACT of TAXES for the year 1937, compiled on Tax Commission forms, was presented to the Board by Mr. Gerhart, and valuation of \$39,712,886 for all County purposes was set up, and taxes apportioned to the subdivisions, totalling \$1,000,477.97.

It was decided that no formal acceptance of the tax abstracts was necessary, and that the County Clerk should send the forms to the State Tax Commission.

On proper motion and vote, the Board adjourned until Wednesday, November 10, 1937.

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session November 10, 1937, with all members and the County Clerk present.

After the NOON recess, the Board convened as a Board of County Commissioners.

Mr. JOHN LAUGHLIN appeared before the Board relative to having a date set for the grading of a road which he had been attempting to secure the grading of for some time.

The Board promised to take up the matter in the near future, and secure the setting of a date for the grading of the road.

Mr. W. C. HAIL, representing W. C. Hail & Company, public accountants, of Lawrence, came before the Board for a conference relative to the letting of the County Audit. Mr. Hail presented various reasons for thinking that his company should be given preference.
