The Board met this date in regular adjourned session, and immediately convened as a <u>Board of Social Welfare</u>, all the members, Chris Schaake, Chairman, James F. Brass and Earl T. Black, members, present, also Mrs. Mildred D. Watson, Welfare Director.

A number of applications for Relief and Old Age grants were carefully investigated and passed upon by the Board, as per records in the Social Welfare offices.

Matters of general interest in the welfare work were gone into and discussed at length.

Following the NOON recess, the Board re-convened as a Board of County Commismioners, and after viewing the premises involved in the widening of a road as petitioned for by EVERETT A.
