DECEMBER 1, A.D. 1937.

The Board of County Commissioners met with the County Director in the Social Welfare Department, and sat as a Board of Social Welfare for the discussion and consideration of Old Age Assistance and Dependent Children. Revisions of Budgets were also taken under consideration.

These matters exhausted practically the hours of the morning session, and adjournment was taken just prior to the noon recess.

Following the noon recess, the Board re-convened as a Board of County Commissioners in its chambers, in adjourned regular session.

There then appeared before the Board a delegation consisting of Messrs. J.D. Flory and Charles H. Jones, members of the Marion Township Board; also Messrs. Cleveland Clark, C. H. Clark, Orville Baker and B. R. Baker; for the purpose of interviewing the Board relative to the construction of a joint bridge over a branch of "8-Mile Creek," adjoining the Steve Clark property.

Following a lengthy discussion, the matter was taken under advisement by the County Commissioners, and also by the County Attorney, Mr. Charles A. Springer.

The matter of widening and straightening the Colver Cemetery Road came on again for a hearing, the following persons appearing before the Board in this behalf: Mrs. G. F. Oehrle and Messrs. Frank Lutz, John E. Smith and A. E. Netsker, interested property owners, and Messrs. J. D. Flory and Charles H. Jones, members of the Marion Township Board. Messrs. E. E. Trueblood, County Engineer, and Charles A. Springer, County Attorney, were also present.

A lengthy and detailed discussion of the matter from varying angles ensued, and every reasonable effort was made, with hearty cooperation of County and Township officials, to arrive at a solution satisfactory to all concerned. It was finally decided to allow Mrs. Oehrle as damages \$25.00, and Mr. Lutz \$40, and Mr. Trueblood, County Engineer, was directed to make out the damage claims.

No further business coming before the Board, adjournment was taken.
