Deposits.

Pursuant to request of the County Commissioners, the following members of the Lawrence Clearing House, namely, Messrs. T. J. Sweeney and George D. Walter, appeared before the Board to discuss the matter of providing necessary securities for County Deposits. Mr. C. B. Holmes, representing the bonding company; Mr. A. M. Gardner, County Treasurer; Mrs. Mildred LeSuer, County Auditor, and Mr. Charles A. Springer, County Attorney, were also present.

No definite agreement was reached. It was the consensus of opinion that the banks would not put up additional security to carry the County over the peak period of tax collections and heavy deposits. The suggestion was made that the banks might bid on the amount of security each bank would provide, and deposits be made in accordance therewith.
