In a regular adjourned meeting, the Board of County Commissioners assembled in the chambers of said Commissioners, in the Douglas County Court House, with all members of the Board, namely: Chris Schaake, Chairman, Earl T. Black and James F. Brass, Commissioners present.

A request for adjustment of real estate valuation was placed before the Board by a Mrs. B. F. Payne. It was stated by Mrs. Payne that the old improvement value on her property described as Lot 60, La. St., now stands on the assessment rolls far excessive of the true value of the old dwelling.

The Board informed Mrs. Payne that all real estate property is to be reassessed beginning the first of March this year, and if she is not satisfied with the new assessment, she will be given an opportunity to appear before the Board of Equalization when they sit for a ten day session, beginning the third Monday in May.

From Eudora, appeared Jack Hughes to discuss with the Board the matter of adjusting the assessment on his property in Eudora. He was also informed by the Board that if he were not satisfied with the new assessment to be placed this year, he may appear before the Commissioners when they sit as a Board of Equalization in May, 1938.

The final bills for the county and for relief of the poor were presented to the Board for its consideration. All bills so submitted were allowed as per Allowance Record.

At this hour of 11:00 A. M., bids from the various oil companies doing business in the county, for gasoline to be furnished to the county for the year 1938, were opened by E. E. Trueblood, County Engineer.

The awarding of the contract was deferred until a later meeting date.

A resolution was presented to the Board by Geo F. Bahnmaier, Trustee of Lecompton Township, authorizing the township to maintain a W.P.A. project under the County Blanket Project, for their signatures thereon.

Mr. Ransom, fire extinguisher salesman, discussed with the Board the need of more fire extinguishers for the courthouse and the County Farm. Although consideration was given to the above, the Commissioners took no action on the matter.

A delegation from Eudora appeared before the Board to consult with the Commissioners the status of the Wakarusa Bridge. Said bridge is badly in need of repair, and the delegation from the City was seeking information as to whether the County would help furnish material and labor for the improvements needed on the bridge. According to investigation by the County Attorney heretofore, the bridge, since it is in the limits of the city, will have to be repaired at the cost of the City and is in no way an obligation to Douglas County.
