E. E. Trueblood, County Engineer, and Alva Hodges, employee in the Engineering Department, met with the Board to confer with the Commissionors on the acceptance of bids for a 1 ton flatbottom truck and a pick-up, as per bids received January 26, 1938.

In conference with the Sheriff, Frod A. Vogler, the Board discussed the matter of hiring a full time, salaried deputy sheriff for the south part of the county, to be situated in Baldwin City. After some considerable discussion the Chairman of the Eoard Chris Schaake and the Sheriff deemed it advisable to make a trip to Baldwin City the following day to discuss the matter with the present part time deputy in regard to his acceptance of the full time position. No definite decision was made as of this day. discussion.

The Sheriff presented the need of a motorcycle for his department, and the Board authorized him to investigate the price, etc. and submit a requisition for the machine.

It was moved by James F. Brass at this time, for the Board to authorize the County Clerk to have five keys made for the outside door of the courthouse, for the use of the Social Welfare Department. Earl T. Black seconded the motion. On vote, motion carried.
