Again, the question of redistricting the Commissioners Districts was discussed, and, again, the Board was unable to reach a conclusion.

The remainder of salary bills for the county employees was allowed, as recorded on the Allowance Record.

The following resolution pertaining to specific increases in wages of County employees was passed:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the matter of the increase of salaries for clerk hire in the office of the Register of Deeds, the office of the Probate Judge and for the Tax Collector for Douglas County, came on for hearing this 4th day of March, 1938, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, after due consideration of the matter, finds that it is necessary in order to properly expedite the business in the Probate Court's office that the salary for clerk hire be increased from \$75 to \$80 per month; and that in order to properly expedite the work in the office of the Register of Deeds, the salary for clerk hire be increased from \$75 to \$80 per month; and that in order to properly expedite the work of the Deputy Sheriff engaged in tax collection, the salary be increased from \$75 to \$80 per month; and the Board further finds that said salary increases are necessary in said offices.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the salaries for Clerk hire in the aforesaid offices be increased to \$80 per month; and that the Deputy Sheriff, Tax Collector's salary be increased to \$80 per month.
