And, inasmuch, as the record of the authorization of this board for sale of temporary notes numbered one and two of the above issue to The First National Bank of Lawrence, Kansas, does not appear in the minutes of the meetings of this board,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board does now approve the sale heretofore made of the temporary notes numbered one and two to The First National Bank of Lawrence, Kansas.
