

Frank Topping, Treasurer of Wakarusa Township Board, conferred with the Board of County Commissioners on matters relative to Wakarusa Township's financial responsibility for improvements on Crescent Road, located in said township.

Before the Board of County Commissioners and the County Engineer, came a Twin Mound delegation, in reference to the straightening of a county road located in Sec. 27, T 13, R 18, Clinton Township. After some discussion on the advantages and disadvantages of said change, the Board informed the said delegation that the matter would be taken under investigation and advisement.
