

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

April 6, 1938

On this 6th day of April, 1938, the Commissioners of Douglas County, sitting as a Board, met in the chambers of said Commissioners, with all members of the Board and the County Clerk present.

Mrs. W. O. Hamilton, Supervisor of the Sewing Room, presented a project pertaining to said Sewing Room, for the approval of the Board. The Chairman of the Board was authorized to sign said papers. (See project on file in the County Clerk's office.)

A delegation, consisting of representatives from the various health agencies in the county and Mildred Le Suer, County Auditor, met with the Board for a discussion on the possibility of establishing a County Health Unit in the county of Douglas.

Considerable discussion was gone into and terminated with the thought of another meeting to be held in the near future.

For a conference with the Board came a committee of the Tax Payers League to discuss specifically the pending tomato project which the county is sponsoring for about fifty families on relief.

Further bills against the county for wages, materials and bills from the Welfare Department were approved by the Board in amounts as recorded on the Warrant Register.

With the County Attorney, the Commissioners, again, considered the redistricting of Commissioners districts. The problem is yet unsolved.

Geo Bigsby, Salesman for the World Company, interviewed the Board on the matter of rebinding and covering certain records in the Probate Judge's office, which are badly in need of repair. However, no authority was given to the order of such work at this time.

As a Board of Social Welfare, the Commissioners reviewed welfare cases with the County Director and the Case Visitors.

Adjournment was taken by the Board.

April 9, 1938.

At 9:30 A. M., all members of the Board of County Commissioners, and the County Clerk, met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board, to attend to matters of business under its jurisdiction.

A conference on the tomato project for relief families, was held by the Commissioners and the County Attorney with representatives of the Tax Payers League, and from the Columbus Food Corporation. No definite action taken at this time.

Commissioners minutes for the month of February were read to the Board for approval of same.

After completion thereof, it was moved by Earl T. Black that the minutes be approved as read. A second was made by James F. Brass, and on vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

The matter of the redistricting of Commissioners districts was again taken up by the Board. As of yet, the Board has failed to reach a conclusion.

The following resolution for application for a beer license was passed by the Board:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on the 9th day of April, 1938, the same being a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, the application of George Chapman for a beer license came on for consideration of said Board, and

WHEREAS, the Board does find that the said George Chapman is in all ways qualified under the law to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on the premises, and

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that a due and legal notice has been given to the Wakarusa Township Board, and that ten days have expired from the giving of said notice, and that no written objection has been filed by the Wakarusa Township Board protesting the granting of a beer license.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the applicant George Chapman be granted a license to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on premises at the place so described in application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk of Douglas County, be, and he is hereby directed to issue said license.
