That all of said bonds shall be registered according to law; shall be sold at not less than par and accrued interest; and shall, together with all interest coupons, be payable at the office of the State Treasurer in the City of Topeka, Kansas, being the fiscal agency of the State of Kansas.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, hereby promises to pay said bonds and the interest coupons attached thereto as the same mature and agrees to annually levy taxes on the property liable for the payment of said bonds in an amount sufficient to pay all interest on said bonds and the principal thereof at maturity.

A small delegation on the matter of the paving of Barker Avenue was in before the Board to discuss the proposition with the Commissioners. Since investigation has not been completed, no decision could be made as of this day.

Considerable time was given to discussion of the changing/boundary lines of precincts in the townships of Douglas County, such authority being granted said Board of County Commissioners by House Bill No. 107, Chap. 223 of the Session Laws of 1937. Present during the discussion was Chas. A. Springer, County Attorney. Also, appearing before the Board came Geo. F. Bahnmaler of Lecompton Township and Ralph Colman, Treasurer of Kanwaka Township.

Decision by the Board was deferred until further townships could be heard from, regarding precincts in their respective townships.

A resolution for a Road Project on 1.27 miles of road in Kanwaka Township was presented to the Board by the Treasurer of said township. Said project to be operated under the County Blanket. Approval was given to same.

As a Board of Social Welfare, the Commissioners received the County Director on Social Welfare business.

Several welfare cases were brought up by the County Director and the Board entered into detail with same. Also, consideration was given to the tomato project sponsored by the county, discussing specifically the transportation of the clients to and from the garden plots.

The Board adjourned to meet April 25, at 9:30 A. M., in regular adjourned session in the meeting rooms of the Board of County Commissioners to sit as said Board.

At 9:30 A. M., this 25th day of April, 1938, the Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board and the County Clerk present.

The first matter under consideration was the boundary changes of precincts in certain townships in the county. Present during this time was the Kanwaka Township Board which suggested that Kanwaka be left as one precinct; and Geo. F. Bahnmaler, Trustee of Lecompton Township, who agreed with the Board that the boundary line between the two precincts in Lec. Twp. be divided as equally as possible.
