

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

May 4, 1938.

In adjourned regular session, this 4th day of May, 1938, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, with all members of said Board and the County Clerk present, met in the Commissioners regular meeting rooms in the Douglas County Court House, at 9:30 A. M.

There appeared before the Board, Estelle Duffee, to again, discuss, her application for employment in the Register of Deeds Office, for certain work on the Numerical Index. Deep consideration was given to the matter, and final decision was made in the following motion: Moved by James F. Brass that Estelle Duffee be employed in the Register of Deeds Office for certain work on the Numerical Index at the wage of 4¢ per entry for the period of one month. Earl T. Black seconded the motion. Chris Schaake, Chairman of the Board, put the motion, and all Commissioners voted "Aye".

Asa Colman, discussed with the Board, the problem confronting this county of the bindweed menace, and the eradication of same. Considerable discussion was given to this matter.

Further claims against the county for wages and materials, and claims from the Welfare Department were allowed by the Board as recorded on record in the County Clerk's office.

Salesman for the Postage Meter Company, L. J. Mitchell, again, came before the Board bringing a specimen machine for demonstration. After a complete demonstration of same, the Board discussed the matter privately and finally deemed it a savings to the county to purchase said machine. Earl T. Black moved that the Board authorize the County Clerk to purchase the Postage Meter machine at the price of \$114.00 f.o.b. James F. Brass seconded the motion. On vote, put by the Chairman, all Commissioners voted in the affirmative.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet Saturday May 7, at 9:30 A. M.

The following resolution, pertaining to the sale of Temporary Notes 5 and 6 for certain roads in West Hills, was passed, by proper motion, second and vote, by the Board:

R E S O L U T I O N

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, that temporary notes numbered five and six, issued for the purpose of paying the cost of improving certain roads in West Hills, adjacent to the City of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas, be sold to the Peoples State Bank of Lawrence, Kansas, at par and accrued interest.
