Board of Equal.

The County Board of Equalization for the year 1938, met in annual session this 16th day of May, 1938, with all members of the Board of County Commissioners, namely: Chris Schaake, Chairman, Earl T. Black and James F. Brass, Commissioners, sitting as said Board of Equalization, and County Clerk T. R. Gerhart as clerk present. The Board was in session daily from May 16 to and including May 26, excepting the 22nd day of May, which fell on Sunday, hearing during that time appeals for both Real Estate and Personal Property.

All adjustments of individual complaints on Real Estate made by the Board, are recorded on the Assessment Rolls in red ink, showing the adjustments both on land and improvements separately. Adjustments on Personal Property are so noted on the Rolls.

At the expiration of the ten day session, the Board adjourned, as required by Statute, to meet on June 17 for the final three day session of said Board.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it is mandatory upon the Board of County Commissioners to redistrict the Commissioner districts of their county every three years when it appears that said districts are not as equal in population as they might be, and

WHEREAS, the first commissioner district of Douglas County, Kansas, has a population of 14,690, the second commissioner district 7,406, and the third commissioner district 4,323, and it appears that Douglas County, Kansas, should be redistricted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Douglas County, Kansas, be and is hereby redistricted and said commissioner districts shall be comprised of the following areas to-wit:

First Commissioner District:
