The Farm Agent, Deal Six, met with the Bourd for a short discussion on the grasshopper situation in Douglas County.

The application for a beer license of Hampton L. Humphrey came on for consideration, and in view of a written objection received by the Lecompton Township Board, in which said township the cereal malt beverage would be sold, Earl T. Black moved that the application of said Hampton L. Humphrey for a beer license to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on promises be denied, and that the fee of \$50.00 for said license be returned to applicant. James F. Erass seconded the motion, and on vote, put by the Chairman, Chris Schaake, the motion carried.

Pursuant thereto, the following resolution was passed:

WHEREAS, Hampton L. Humphrey, a resident of Locompton Township, has made application to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County for a license to retail cereal malt beverages, and

Gerhart, County Clerk of Douglas County is hereby directed to refund the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) to Hampton L. Humphrey which was deposited with said application for said license.
