June 1, 1938

In regular session this 1st day of June, 1938, the Board of County Commissioners met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board, with all members and the County Clerk present.

Claims against the county for salaries of employees, and welfare bills from the Welfare Department were presented to the Board, carefully scrutinized by same, and allowed as recorded on the Allowance Record, said claims being allowed by motion, properly seconded and voted by the Board.

Again, before the Board, came Captain Olin Brigman of the Salvation Army to determine if the County is willing to make some contribution to the Penny Ice Fund. The Board informed Captain Brigman that it did not consider it a matter for the County to make such contribution; and suggested that he try to secure financial aid by contribution from another source.

As per adjournment taken on June 3, the Board of County Commissioners convened this day, with all members of said Board and the County Clerk present.

The Board discussed with A. E. Mitchell, Attorney and Charles A. Springer, County Attorney, the tax causes of the Alpha Xi Chapter of Sigma Chi Fraternity, and the Chi Omega Fraternity. Detailed discussion was given to same. Whereupon, the following resolution was adopted by the Commissioners:

## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, there is pending in the Supreme Court of Kansas, the cause of the Alpha Xi Chapter of Sigma Chi Fraternity, against the Board of County Commissioners, being Cause No. 33641; and the cause of the Chi Omega Fraternity, against the Board of County Commissioners, being Cause No. 33642, in which said causes, the Board of County Commissioners is the Appellee, and

WHEREAS, said causes of action were brought by said Appellants to enjoin the taxing officials of Douglas County from collecting taxes from the Appellants on the
