The Bindweed Committee for Douglas County was also organized as per the following resolution:

> RESOLUTION DESIGNATING COUNTY BINDWEED COMMITTEE and the second secon

WHEREAS, Chapter 1 of the Session Laws of Kansas, 1937, makes it mandatory for the Board of County Commissioners to control the spread of and to eradicate all weeds declared by legislative action to be noxious on all lands owned or supervised by them, and to use such method for that purpose and at such times as are approved and adopted by the State Board of Agriculture, and

WHEREAS, field bindweed is declared to be a noxious weed, and

WHEREAS, a program for the eradication of said noxious weed in Douglas County has been set up by the Board of County Commissioners of said county, comprising therein the organization of a county bindweed committee, which shall consist of Chris Schaake, Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, who shall be Chairman of said committee; Earl T. Black and James F. Brass, Commissioners; T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk, who shall be members of said committee; and Deal Six, Farm Agent, who shall be Secretary of the county bindweed committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that Chris Schaake, be and is hereby designated as Chairman of the Douglas County Bindweed Committee; Earl T. Black, James F. Brass and T. R. Ger-hart, be and are hereby designated as members of said committee and Deal Six be and is hereby designated as Secretary of said committee.

ADOPTED this 6th day of June, 1938.

Before the Board, appeared Asa Colman, to discuss therewith the employing of a County Weed Supervisor for Douglas County. The matter was deliberated thoroughly by the Commissioners, their reaching the following conclusion:

James F. Brass moved that Asa Colman be employed as County Weed Supervisor for Douglas County, at the compensation of \$4.00 per day plus necessary mileage at 4¢ per mile; said mileage not to exceed \$35.00 per month for a period of five months, appointment to become effective this day. Earl T. Black seconded the motion. On vote, put by the Chairman Chris Schaake, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

Authorization was given to T. F. Yost to order nine tons of sodium chlorate to be combined in Franklin County's shipment of same.

No further business appearing before the Board, said Board adjourned to meet in regular adjourned session June 7, 1938.
