June 8, 1938.

The Board met in regular adjourned session this 8th day of June, 1938, with all members of the Board and the County Clerk present.

On several matters of business with the Board, appeared C. C. Stewart, Attorney, and Mildred LeSuer, County Auditor.

Bids on the election supplies for the forthcoming Primary and General elections, were received this day and opened by the Board. Present during the opening, were, A. L. Socolofsky of the Saml Dodsworth Stationery Company; L. C. Leitnaker, representing the Baldwin Ledger and O. W. Maloney, representing the World Company.

Brass that the contract for election supplies for both the Primary and General elections, be awarded to the World Company at the cost of \$597.85, as stated in bid received and opened this day. A second was made by Earl T. Black, and on vote, put by the Chairman Chris Schaake, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

John F. Henry, Representative of the J. Turner Company, appeared before the Board in an attempt to secure an order for sodium chlorate. However, the Board informed the said Mr. Henry, that it has already placed an order for same.

James F. Brass moved that the county purchase #68, 8 ft. 9-14 in. duckfoot machine, as per specifications above, at the price of \$155.00, delivered as soon as possible. Earl T. Black seconded the motion. On vote, motion carried.

Another bid, presented by W. R. Green of Green Brothers, was received by the Board and opened:

8 ft. John Deere C. C. field cultivator, with 14 in. sweeps, rubber tires, power lift and tractor hitch.	\$165.00
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After careful thought to such bid, James F. Brass moved that the county purchase the above machine as mentioned, at the above price of \$165.00. Earl T. Black seconded the motion. On vote, put by Chris Schaake, Chairman, the motion carried by unanimous vote.
