### TAX RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

WHEREAS, West Hills Parkway, Emery Road, Stratford Road, and University Drive, as described in the proceedings relative thereto, have been paved and otherwise improved under the provisions of Section 68-728 of the General Statutes of Kansas, for 1935, and the total cost of such improvements, over and above that paid by agencies of the Federal Government and Wakarusa Township, is by law to be assessed against the property abutting thereon equally per front foot,

THERE ARE HEREBY LEVIED, for the purpose of paying such costs, special tax assessments on the various tracts of land abutting on such respective roads as follows:
