To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners,

Gentlemen:

For the legally issued General Obligation bonds of Douglas County, Kansas, in the par value of \$15,000.00 delivered to us at our office in Topeka, Kansas, dated to mature \$1500 each year from 1 to 10 years to be in denomination of \$500.00 bearing interest from date, 8-1-1938 at the rate of 1 3/4 % per annum payable semi-annually both principal and interest payable at Fiscal Agency.

WE WILL PAY par and accrued interest from date of issue to date of delivery plus a premium of \$9.01 per \$1000.00 Bond.

This offer is for immediate acceptance only and is made subject to the approval of their legality by some recognized bond attorney to be designated by us and whose fee we will pay. You agree to furnish us full and complete transcript of all proceedings incident to the issuance of said bonds.

As evidence of our good faith we enclose herewith check in the amount of \$325.00 to be held by you uncashed until legality of bonds has been approved and when bonds are approved this check is to apply as part payment. This check to be returned to us promptly if our attorneys decline to approve legality of bonds, or if our bid is not accepted.
