July 30, 1938.

In adjourned regular session this 30th day of July, 1938, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board with all members and the County Clerk present.

It being apparent that the Douglas County Republican was low bidder on Delinquent Real Estate Tax Sale Record Book, James F. Brass moved the bid of said company be accepted at the price of \$47.50. Further moved that the Saml Dodsworth Company's bid of \$48.50 for Bond Register be accepted; that the bid of the Baldwin Ledger for Tax Receipt Books at the price of \$205.00; and that the bid of the Douglas County Republican, combining therein the Delinquent or Redemption Books - 12 in number, and the Personal Property Tax Warrants for the total price of \$117.50 be also accepted. Earl T. Black seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Chris Schaake, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

Discussion on the County budget for the year 1939 was gone into with the Board and the County Auditor.

August 1, 1938.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session this 1st day of August, 1938, with all the Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

It was moved by Earl T. Black, that the claims against the county presented to said Board, be allowed as recorded on the Allowance Record in the County Clerk's Office. James F. Brass second the motion. On vote, motion carried.

In an effort for a compromise on taxes, appeared Mrs. W. L. Anderson, who stated that unless such compromise is forthcoming, her property, now mortgaged to HOLC, would be subject to foreclosure. She asked for abatement on the 1934 and 1935 taxes, contending that, if this is done, she will be able to pay the other taxes to date. After hearing the appeal, the Board informed Mrs. Anderson that it would take the matter under advisement.

The road petition of W. D. Patton et al for the relocation of a road in Clinton Township, known as the Twin Mound Road, was, again, brought up for discussion before the Board by the County Engineer. After some discussion, Earl T. Black moved that the Twin Mound Road petition be denied because the change of said road does not merit the additional cost thereof. James F. Brass seconded the motion. On vote, called by the Chairman, the motion carried by affirmative vote.
