restrictions, and limitations of the Constitution and laws of the State of Kansas, relating to the paving and otherwise improving of roads without the limits of any incorporated city and within counties having a population in excess of 20,000 inhabitants, and particularly Article 1 of Chapter 10 and Sections 68-728, 729 and 730 of the General Statutes of Kansas for 1935, and all other laws pertaining thereto, and by virtue of proceedings had and taken and resolutions legally adopted by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, and this bond and all other bonds of this series, together with all interest to become due thereon, are to be paid by Douglas County, Kansas.

It is hereby declared and certified that all acts, conditions and things required to be done and to exist precedent to and in connection with the issuance of this bond and the series mentioned have been properly done and performed according to the Constitution and the Laws of the State of Kansas, and that the total indebtedness of said county issuing this obligation, including this series of bonds, does not exceed the constitutional or statutory limitations.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, said County of Douglas, by its Board of County Commissioners, has caused this bond to be signed by the Chairman of said Board, and attested by the County Clerk of said County, and its corporate seal to be affixed hereto, and the interest coupon hereto attached to show the facsimile signatures of the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk of said county, and this bond to be dated August 1, 1938.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, hereby promises to pay said bonds and the interest coupons attached thereto as the same mature and agrees to annually levy taxes on the property liable for the payment of said bonds in an amount sufficient to pay all interest on said bonds and the principal thereof at maturity.

The monthly report of the Bindweed Supervisor, Asa R. Colman, was approved as submitted to the Board.

In adjourned regular session this 3rd day of August, 1938, all members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board.

A delegation appeared before the Board of County Commissioners for the purpose of discussing the Twin Mound Road petition which was denied by the Board under date of August 1; said petition having been denied because the change in said road, prayed for in this petition, would necessitate the purchase of approximately four acres of land, and cause damages to other land through which the road will run; further there will be considerable cost for new drainage structures and heavy grading; and over one mile of new right-of-way fence.

Considerable discussion was gone into, however, no further action was taken.

The Board adjourned to meet Friday, August 5, to canvass the poll books as returned by the Clerks of Election.
