August 9, 1938.

The Board of County Commissioners met to sit as the Board of Canvassers for the purpose of canvassing In-State, Out of County ballots.

All absentee ballots of voters within the state were presented to the Board by the County Clerk. Said ballots were carefully checked as to qualification of voter, and after so doing, were tabulated and counted as per Poll book on file with the County Clerk.

The Board of Canvassers adjourned to meet Wednesday, August 10, at 9 o'clock as the Board of County Commissioners.

In regular adjourned session, all members of the Board of County Commissioners met to attend to regular county business, there being present, also, T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk.

Discussion was gone into with the Board and the County Attorney on the matter of making application to the State Tax Commission for authority to raise an additional 1 mill levy for the Social Welfare Fund of Douglas County. Whereupon, the following resolution was drawn up:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it appears to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that the rate of levy for the Poor is so limited in said county, as to be insufficient to raise the necessary funds for said purposes for the ensuing tax year, and

WHEREAS, it appears that it is necessary for Douglas County, Kansas, to make a total levy in the Poor Fund of 2.625 mills, and

WHEREAS, it appears that under Section 79-1947, General Statutes, 1935, it is necessary that the Board of County Commissioners make application to the State Tax Commission for authority to levy an additional tax of not exceeding 1 mill for the purpose of raising sufficient funds to take care of the Poor in Douglas County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that application be made to the State Tax Commission for authority to levy 1 mill for the purpose of raising necessary funds for the Poor in Douglas County, which levy is in addition to all other levies provided by law.

APPLICATION TO THE STATE TAX COMMISSION FOR
PERMISSION TO LEVY ADDITIONAL POOR FUNDS AS
PROVIDED FOR IN THE PROVISION UNDER SECTION
79-1947, GENERAL STATUTES, 1935.

TO THE HONORABLE STATE TAX COMMISSION
OF THE STATE OF KANSAS:

WHEREAS, it has become apparent by the unanimous opinion of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that the rate of levy for the Poor in said county, is so limited as to be insufficient for raising the necessary funds for such purpose for the ensuing tax year, and that it will be necessary to levy an additional tax not exceeding one mill on the dollar on all taxable property in said county:

NOW, THEREFORE, this applicant prays of the Honorable Tax Commission of the State of Kansas, that it set down a date for a hearing on this Application; and that it find additional need for such additional levy; and that it empower the said County Commissioners to order such additional levy within the limits hereof as may be shown to be necessary.
