

August 17, 1938.

In adjourned regular session, the Board of County Commissioners, met, this day, to sit as a Board of Canvassers for the purpose of canvassing the Out of State ballots of the Primary Election held August 2, 1938.

The ballots, as received in the office of the County Clerk, were presented to the Board, opened, verified, tabulated and counted as per poll book on file in the County Clerk's Office. After the canvass of said ballots, the Board of Canvassers adjourned to convene as the Board of County Commissioners for action on regular county business.

The claim of the First National Bank on Temporary Notes Nos. 1, 2, 7, 8, and 9, in the amount of \$5000.00 plus \$108.40 interest; the claim of the Peoples State Bank on Temporary Notes Nos. 5, 6, 10 and 11, in the amount of \$4000.00 plus \$85.95 interest; the claim of the Lawrence National Bank on Temporary Notes Nos. 3, 4, 12, 13, and 14 in the amount of \$4500.00 plus \$96.66 interest; and the claim of C. C. Stewart for attorney fees in the amount of \$500.00; all claims pertaining to the West Hills Project, were by motion of James F. Brass, seconded by Earl T. Black, and by unanimous vote, allowed this 17th day of August.

No further business appearing; the Board adjourned to meet in the Commissioners rooms at 9 o'clock Thursday morning, August 18 before proceeding to Topeka for a hearing with the State Tax Commission.

The County of Douglas, by its Board of County Commissioners, having made application to the State Tax Commission for authority to levy 1 mill for the purpose of raising necessary funds for the Poor in said county, which levy is in addition to all other levies provided by law, the State Tax Commission notified the Board of County Commissioners that a hearing on said application would be held before the State Tax Commission on August 18, 1938.

In accordance with said notice, all Commissioners met at the Court House at 9 o'clock A. M.; and then, proceeded to Topeka where said Commissioners, namely; Chris Schaaake; Chairman, Earl T. Black and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk, Mildred LeSuer, County Auditor, Chas. A. Springer, County Attorney and Mildred D. Watson, County Director, appeared at the hearing and presented evidence of the need of the additional 1 mill levy for the Poor of Douglas County.

Whereupon, the State Tax Commission issued its order granting the application, a copy of said order recorded in the Commissioners' Record, as below:

Now on this 18th day of August, 1938, the above entitled matter comes on for hearing before the Tax Commission.

The Commission after being fully advised in the premises and considering the evidence, finds that the applicant county has given notice of this hearing as required by law, a copy of which notice together with proof of publication are filed herein, and both of which are hereby approved.

The Commission further finds, that the rates of levy in said County are so limited as to be insufficient to provide the funds necessary in its Welfare Fund during the current budget year, and that it is necessary that the said county be authorized to levy an additional one mill in its Welfare Fund.

It is, Therefore, by the Commission, Considered and Ordered that Douglas County, Kansas, be, and it hereby is authorized to levy an additional one mill in its Welfare Fund for the current budget year, as provided under Statute 79-1947 General Statutes of 1935.
