The Board of County Commissioners, with all members of same and the County Clerk present, reconvened in the rooms of said Board, to attend to regular county business.

Consideration was given to the acceptance of a coal bid for coal to be furnished to the county for the season of 1938-1939, as per bids received August 10.

The bids, were, again, gone over in detail by the Commissioners, and after so doing, it was moved by James F. Brass that the contract for county coal during the 1938-1939 season be awarded to the Logan-Moore Lumber Company and the Orley M. Smith Coal Company, share and share alike, at the prices stated in their bids: \$4.19 for the month of August, \$4.39 for the month of September and \$4.59 for balance of season; said companies being the lowest bidders on Deep Shaft Cherokee Lump coal. Earl T. Black seconded the motion. All Commissioners voted "Aye" on vote called by the Chairman of the Board.

Brass and by affirmative vote of all Commissioners, ordered sold to the First National Bank at par and accrued interest.

By motion, properly seconded and vote, the Board adjourned to meet Wednesday, August 24, 1938, at 9 o'clock A. M.
