As per adjournment, the Commissioners of Douglas County, sitting as a Board, met this day, in the regular meeting rooms in the Court House; there being present, also, County Clerk T. R. Gerhart.

Jim Hodges, employed as a blacksmith for the county, appeared before the Board requesting that his hourly wage of 30¢ be increased. The Board informed the said Jim Hodges that this matter would be discussed with the County Engineer.

Mr. F. M. Hartman, Mrs. Louise Riley and Mrs. Katie Hayes formed a delegation meeting with the County Commissioners in regard to the grading and rocking of a road known as the Franklin Road; said road situated in the southern part of the county. Because of the condition of the road, ungraded and unrocked, bad weather conditions makes it almost impassable. The Board listened attentively to the arguments presented; and at the conclusion, informed said delegation that it, with the County Engineer, would view said road at the nearest possible date.

The County Engineer discussed several matters of business with the Board among them the improvement of the above road and the salary increase of Jim Hodges, employee of the county. After considering the latter, the Board agreed that said Jim Hodges merits a salary increase and by unanimous opinion increased the hourly 30¢ to 35¢. wage of

Sheriff Fred A. Vogler, was called before the Board for a discussion on several matters pertaining to his department.

For a reduction in valuation of his property, appeared Earl A. Torneden. However, the Board informed him that the time for equalization has passed; and that the only probable chance for a reduction would be to make an appeal to the State Tax Commission next Spring.

Further claims against the county for wages and materials, were by motion of James F. Brass, seconded by Earl T. Black and unanimous vote, approved and passed as recorded on the Allowance Record in the office of the County Clerk.

No further business coming before the Board, the Board adjourned to meet again the afternoon of the 13th.
