The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, with a majority of the members of the Board, and the County Clerk, met this day to attend to regular county business.

Louis Johnson, Supervisor of a Recreational and Adult Educational W. P. A. project discussed with the Board the matter of the county furnishing sufficient room in which classes of this project may be held. The Board assured Mr. Johnson that the matter would be taken under consideration, and an attempt be made to secure some rooms that may be available.

George Bigsby, Salesman for the Thacher Supply, Inc., Topeka, Kansas, appeared before the Board in an effort to interest said Board in the purchase of a large card file for the office of the County Auditor. Although, the purchase was discussed, no action was taken this day.

A Mr. Strobe and Mr. Taylor, interested in the W.P.A. project set up for the care of pre-school children, came before the Board, desiring to know if the county would be willing to help keep this project going full time, by furnishing about 12 folding cots, 12 sheets, 12 spreads and 12 pillows for the use of the children in taking naps; and furnishing such food as milk, sugar, cocoa, graham crackers or soup etc. The county was, also, asked if it would consider paying for gasoline to be used by someone to pick up these small children and bring them to the school.

The Board informed the two men appearing before it, that the matter would have to be taken under consideration, and that the Board would take the matter up with the County Director.
