Claims against the county for salaries, wages, materials and supplies; and claims from the Welfare Department were presented to the Board, and by unanimous vote of all Commissioners, allowed as recorded on the Allowance Record as of this day.

For a short discussion on bindweed matters, came Asa R. Colman.

The Delinquent Tax Sale was discussed with Ernest Klooz, Abstractor in the compiling of data relative to same.

The Board adjourn to meet on Monday, October 3, 1938.

In regular adjourned session this 3rd day of October, 1938, all members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board.

Joe Zellner, Eudora, met with the Board to discuss a claim sent to Douglas County, covering the court costs of Barbara Zellner, on a hearing held in Topeka, Kansas. The claim is in the amount of \$34.70. Mr. Zellner stated that he was unable to pay said costs at this time, but he would make an attempt to pay same in installments whenever he could raise sufficient money. The Board agreed to pay this claim in accordance with this arrangement.

As per adjournment, the Commissioners of Douglas County met as a Board this day, there being present all members and the County Clerk.

Further claims against the county for wages, supplies and materials and claims from the Welfare Department were scrutinized and allowed by unanimous vote, said claims being recorded on the Allowance Record in the office of the County Clerk.

Trustees

At 10 o'clock A. M., W. R. Taylor and O. Q. Claflin met with the Board of County Commissioners, relative to the compromise of delinquent taxes against the Kansas City, Kaw Valley and Western Railroad Company. Harry Frazee, Attorney on the case and Charles A. Springer, County Attorney, also, were present.

Again, the Trustees repeated their offer of compromising on the basis of 12½%, contending that this is as much as they can possibly pay on the delinquent taxes. The Board inquired that, in the event, they were willing to accept a compromise on the interest and penalty, if the Trustees would consider this. They added, however, that the county would consider no compromise on the current year's tax. O. Q. Claflin informed the Board that they couldn't make a settlement with one county on a different basis than that of another county, and recognizing the fact they have only \$2500 set up for these taxes in three counties, it would be impossible to pay more than 12½%. No official action was taken this day, another meeting be set for Wednesday, October 19, 1938.

Allen French, Auditor, appeared before the Board for a few minutes discussion on the county audit.

At 2 o'clock P. M., bids on a metal file cabinet for use by the County Auditor were received and opened. Bids follow:

Construction, throughout, to be standard Grade A as furnished by the Steel Institute.
