As per adjournment, the Board of County Commissioners met in the regular meeting rooms of the Board, with all Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

A Mr. Snider and Mr. Smith, Salesmen for the Industrial Machinery Company, Kansas City, Kansas, appeared before the Board to interest same in the purchase of a steam shovel for the use of the Engineering Department. They expressed their desire that the Board accompany them to Joplin, Mo. to view said shovel. It was agreed by the Board to accompany said salesmen to Joplin for the purpose of viewing the shovel, on Monday, December 12; to start at the hour of 8 o'clock.

The application of Mary E. Ledebor for admission to the State Sanatorium for T. B. at Norton, was presented to the Board for its consideration. After carefully viewing same, it was moved by Commissioner Brass that the Board accept the application and authorize that said Mary E. Ledebor be admitted to the State Sanatorium as a county patient. Commissioner Black seconded the motion. On vote, put by Chris Schaeke, Chairman, the motion carried.

A Mr. Wilson, Tire Salesman for the Montgomery Ward Company came before the Board seeking sales.

The Board, accompanied by Charles Banning, made inspection of the Jail and dwelling in regard to improvements to be made on same.

Five road petitions, signed by S. H. Hunter and sixteen others, were presented to the Board of County Commissioners, praying for the location of roads to be known as: Sunset Drive, Stratford Road, Oxford Road, High Drive, and Cambridge Place. Said petitions were placed on file in the office of the County Clerk, pending action.

A conference for discussion on the tax distribution, was held by the County Board with A. M. Gardner, County Treasurer, T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk, Mildred LeSuer, County Auditor, and Allen French, Auditor.
