The Board of County Commissioners disorganized, whereupon the following motions were in order:

Jas. F. Brass moved that Earl T. Black be elected as Chairman of the Board for the current year. Chris Schaake seconded the motion. On vote, it was unanimous that Commissioner Black be Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, acting in that capacity for the period of one year.

Chris Schaake moved that Jas. F. Brass be elected as Vice-Chairman for the year of 1939. Earl T. Black seconded the motion, and by unanimous vote, said motion carried.

It was moved by Jas. F. Brass that E. E. Trueblood be re-appointed as County Engineer for the year 1939 at the salary of \$175.00 per month. Chris Schaake seconded the motion. On vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

Chris Schaake moved that John F. Metsker be re-appointed as Superintendent of the County Farm at the salary of \$60.00 per month, and that Mrs. Pearl E. Metsker be re-appointed as Matron of the County Home at the salary of \$65.00 per month, said appointments to be for the current year. Jas. F. Brass seconded the motion. On vote, the motion carried.

Jas. F. Brass moved that Mildred LeSuer be re-appointed as *Budget Director* for the year 1939 at the wage of 75¢ per hour. Chris Schaake seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Earl T. Black, the motion carried.

Motion for appointment of Ed Anderson for Tax Collector/was made by Chris Schaake. A second was made by Jas. F. Brass. Earl T. Black, Chairman called for a vote, which brought affirmative action.

It was moved by Commissioner Brass that Mildred D. Watson be re-appointed to the position of County Welfare Director for the current year at the salary of \$150.00 per month. Commissioner Schaake seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Black, the motion carried.

Dr. H. Penfield Jones, County Health Physician met with the Board to discuss his appointing an assistant to aid him in giving medical attention to the relief clients of Douglas County. It had come to the attention of the Board by several different sources that Dr. Enders, now employed by Dr. Jones, was a highly qualified doctor for said position, and it has been requested that the Board approve him to continue in this capacity. Dr. Jones said that he would take the matter up with Dr. Enders and with Dr. Mott, the latter whom was, also, being considered for this position.

E. E. Morris of the Dunne-Israel Investment Company, again, appeared before the Board for discussion on the Refunding Bond Issue. His proposal was presented to the Board, and after deep consideration on same, Chris Schaake moved that the proposal, as submitted by Mr. Morris, be accepted. Jas. F. Brass seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Earl T. Black, the motion carried.
