Chris Schaaque moved that the supplies for the County Jail, namely: Mattresses, mattress covers and pillow slips be purchased from the Veatch's Furniture Company, as per the total amount in their bid as stated above, \$124.95. Jas. F. Brass seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Earl T. Black, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

There came before the Board Dr. J. M. Mott, in regard to the position of assistant to Dr. H. Penfield Jones, County Health Physician. Dr. Mott stated that there seemed to be some misunderstanding, as he was of the opinion the Board had approved his filling this position. The Commissioners informed Dr. Mott that the Board of County Commissioners deemed it best to have Dr. Enders to continue in this capacity, but it wished to consider Dr. Mott for medical attention to the obstetrical cases and others that he has done in the past, with the County paying some compensation for this work.

In reference to the above, Jas. F. Brass moved that Dr. J. M. Mott be employed as assistant to the County Health Physician, his work confined to the obstetrical and venereal disease cases, to be paid the compensation of \$25.00 per month, said amount to be paid from the County Welfare Fund. Chris Schaaque seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Black, the motion carried by affirmative vote.

A motion was made by Chris Schaaque that the Board re-appoint Dr. H. Penfield Jones as County Health Physician for the current year at the salary of \$125.00 per month, plus necessary mileage. A second was made by Jas. F. Brass. On vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

With Clyde Hosford came Jim Bryant seeking the position of Janitor for the Court House if such position be vacant. Mr. Bryant was highly recommended by Mr. Hosford. The Board informed said Mr. Bryant that his application would be considered if a vacancy for Janitor occurred.

No further business coming before the Board, said Board adjourned to meet in regular adjourned session Wednesday, January 18.
