Claims against the county for salaries, wages, materials and supplies were by motion, properly seconded and voted, allowed by the Board as recorded on the Allowance Record on file in the office of the county clerk.

Mr. and Mrs. John Metsker from the County Home met with the Board for a general discussion on the affairs of the County Farm and Home.

Gladys Hardtarfer, who has been employed for typing work on the Judicial Sale came before the Board to discuss the hourly wage at which she is to receive. She considered that the 30¢ per hour, as formerly suggested, was not sufficient compensation for the work. The Board agreed that 35¢ per hour was a fair wage, and her claim was allowed at this rate.

The claim of Esther Sanders, Stenographer in the County Superintendent's Office, was allowed for an additional compensation of \$15.00 per month for additional mimeograph work that Miss Sanders does in her office for other offices located in the courthouse. This supplementary amount brings her claim up to \$60.00 monthly.

At the hour of 11 o'clock bids on trucks, both dump and pick-ups, were opened by the County Engineer and the Board of County Commissioners. Ten bids were received in all. Several representatives from the various companies bidding were present at the opening.
