February 15, 1939.

In adjourned regular session this 15th day of February, 1939, the Board of County Commissioners, all members being present, met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board. Also, present, was T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk.

Clifford Harding of the Farm Security Administration presented a report on the work of Mr. Stuckey, to the Board. He again asked if the Board would allow him to maintain said Mr. Stuckey until June 1, as Franklin County agreed to do. After considering the matter, the Board agreed on a 60 day extension of time which sets the time to May 1, under the present arrangements. Harding agreed to submit a report of his work each month to the Commissioners.

Bonds of county officials were closely inspected and then approved by the Board.

The claim of Paul Clawson for \$33.20 for T-B cow, representing Douglas County's portion of payment, was by unanimous vote of the Board, allowed this day.

Bindweed matters were discussed with the Board by Asa Colman, former Bindweed Supervisor. He asked that the Board give consideration to his application for the position this year.

Discussion was taken up on vacation time of the employees of the courthouse. Considerable thought was given to the establishment of a definite policy in regard to same. It was finally moved by Jas. F. Brass that all employees of the county, other than those elected to office, be granted one week's vacation or at their option one week's sick leave with pay. Any additional time will be taken at the employee's expense. A person in order to be eligible should be employed for at least six months. This ruling also applies to the Welfare Department. Chris Schaake seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Black, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

The Board also informed the County Director, Mrs. Mildred D. Watson, that in the future no Saturday afternoons would be taken off by any employee of the county. The Saturday afternoon-off policy had heretofore been established in the Welfare Department because of the State's custom.

The bond for the appeal to the Circuit Court of Appeals in regard to the K. C. K. V. and W RR matter, was presented to the Board by Harry Frazee, attorney. Said bond is in the amount of \$250.00. Given authority, the Chairman of the Board placed his signature on same.

For a short conference on Senate Bill No. 2, came the county clerk, county engineer and two members of the Board of County Commissioners of Atchison County.

With the County Engineer and County Director, the Board discussed the matter of securing a truck to be used by the Welfare Department. Jas. F. Brass moved that E. E. Trueblood, County Engineer, be authorized to investigate as to one used truck, to be used for the Welfare Department, and report back to the Board at the next meeting. Chris Schaake seconded the motion. On vote, all Commissioners voted in favor of said motion.

The Board adjourned to meet again Saturday, February 18, at the hour of 9 A. M.
