BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, by a majority of its members are satisfied from the proofs and evidence that due and legal notice has been given by publication as required in this act, and that no private rights will be injuried or endangered by such vacation or exclusion, and that the public will suffer no loss or inconvenience thereby and that in justice to the petitioners the prayer of the petitioners ought to be granted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said plat of the above described tract of land should be and is hereby vacated and cancelled. And that the County Clerk shall certify a copy of this order to the Register of Deeds of this County, which order the Register of Deed shall record in the Deed Records of this County at the expense of the petitioners and the said Register of Deed shall mark the said recorded plat "Cancelled by Order".
