March 15, 1939.

The Board of County Commissioners, with all members and the County Clerk present, met this day in regular adjourned session.

Second bids received--the first bids, having been rejected--were presented to the Board and opened:

No decision was made on the bids at this time.

Again, S. O. Weeks appeared before the Board offering to give \$40.00 for a motorcycle used by the Sheriff's Department. The Board asked \$50.00 for the machine. Finally, an agreement was reached whereas said Mr. Weeks would pay the amount of \$45.00. Whereupon, Chris Schaake moved that the county sell said motorcycle, now in possession of the Sheriff, to one S. O. Weeks, at the price of \$45.00, this amount to be credited to the General Fund of the county. Jas. F. Brass seconded the motion. On vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

For a few minutes discussion came Charles Banning, Sheriff and Milton P. Beach, County Attorney in regard to the beer situation in the county. The Rose Bud Tavern owned by L. B. Robinson was the subject for discussion, both the Sheriff and the County Attorney reporting that numerous complaints had been received about this place of business. It was recommended that the beer license heretofore issued to said Mr. Robinson be revoked. The Board authorized the County Clerk to send a notice to L. B. Robinson and that a hearing be set for 9 o'clock A. M., Wednesday, March 22, 1939.

The County Engineer brought up the subject of awarding the oil contract, this being the last day for the old contract. After carefully scrutinizing the bids, Chris Schaake moved that the contract for oil to be furnish the county for the year 1939, be let to the Skelly Oil Company at the price of 45¢ per gallon, as indicated in bid received. Jas. F. Brass seconded the motion. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

The road petition of T. H. Mack et al was by unanimous vote of the Board accepted, and viewing date set for Saturday, April 8, at the hour of 2 P. M.

In the interest of the Nursery School, came George Hedrick, Secretary of the Chamber of Commerce and Lloyd Houston from the Board of Education.

Action on the printing bids was taken with Chris Schaake moving that the contract for the legal printing for the year 1939, be awarded to the Journal World, as per their bid submitted this day.

It was decided by the Board that the above motion be left open for action at a later date.

Upon motion, the Board adjourned to meet again Monday March 20, 1939.

In regular adjourned session, the Board of County Commissioners met this day with all members of said Board and the County Clerk present.

S. J. Hunter met with the Board and the County Engineer in regard to certain road petitions (5) which he had submitted heretofore for action by the Board. After considering same, the Board stated that it desired to confer with the County Attorney before taking action on said petitions.

Three (3) road petitions, praying for the vacation of certain roads in Douglas County (described on petitions), signed by Oren Owen and twelve others were presented to the Board of County Commissioners.

Jas. F. Brass moved that these petitions be accepted and that the date of viewing be set for 2 O'clock P. M., Wednesday, April 12. Chris Schaake seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Black, all Commissioners voted in the affirmative.

In regard to the motion made under date of March 15, awarding the printing contract to the Journal World, it was added that this includes all regular county printing with the exception of the Judicial Tax Sale notices and the Delinquent Tax list, said printing to be done at the price stipulated in the bid received with a maximum total of \$1400.00. Said motion was seconded by Earl T. Black, and put to vote by Acting-Chairman Jas. F. Brass, with the motion carrying by unanimous vote.
