The County Attorney discussed the Judicial Tax Sale with the Commissioners. The following resolution regarding same was passed by the Board.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it is authorized by Section 79-2801 to 79-2806 G. S., 1935 for the County to file a foreclosure suit and sell lands, which have been carried on the tax rolls for a certain number of years, without having had the taxes paid thereon.

AND WHEREAS there are numerous parcels of land on the tax rolls of Douglas County, which have been carried on the rolls of this County, without having said taxes paid thereon, which would be subject to the judicial sale referred to above.

AND WHEREAS it is the desire of the said Douglas County to proceed to sell the said property and place the land back on the tax rolls on a paying basis.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the County Attorney of Douglas County be instructed as provided by law to proceed with the judicial sale as authorized by the sections above mentioned and to institute and carry out to completion the said proceeding.

The above resolution was presented and discussed by the members of the Douglas County Board. It was moved by Mr. Chris Schaake and seconded by Mr. James Brass that the resolution be adopted. The resolution was carried by a unanimous vote.

In regular adjourned session this day, the Board of County Commissioners, with all members and the County Clerk present, met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board at the hour of 9 A. M.

The Wakarusa Township Board, namely, Ed Johnson, Chester C. Howard and Chester Spray met with the Commissioners to discuss the matter of the road petitions (5) formerly presented to the Board of County Commissioners by S. J. Hunter. Said petitions are on file in the office of the County Clerk. These petitions call for the location of certain roads to be known as: Cambridge Place, Sunset Drive, Oxford Road, High Drive and Stratford Road.

At the hour of 1:30 P. M., on the above matter came S. J. Hunter, County Attorney Milton P. Beach and County Engineer, E. E. Trueblood. The Board wished to take no action until a few matters of business pertaining to this matter be settled.

Commissioner's minutes for the months of November and December were read by the Board and by motion, properly seconded and voted, approved as read.

A delegation, consisting of about 17 people, representatives from the Lawrence Chamber of Commerce and the Topeka Chamber of Commerce, met with the Board of County Commissioners in the interest of the Lake View Club. Among those present, were: J. R. Holmes, A. A. Green, Wesley Brune, John Brand, George Hedrick, David McCreath, Dr. Clement Smith and W. G. Dickey. The purpose of the meeting was to present arguments as to the club and lake being an asset to the citizens of Douglas County, and to determine if the county would sponsor some means whereby water could be furnished to the lake which is in dire need of same. Much discussion was gone into, but the Board gave no answer at this time.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned until Wednesday, March 29, 1939, at the hour of 8:30 A. M.
