## <sup>A</sup>pril 19, 1939.

The Board of County Commissioners, all members being present and the County Clerk met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board, in regular adjourned session.

Action for rental of house for Mursery School recorded in Welfare Minute Book.

A road petition signed by John Brecheisen and seventeen others for the altering, widening and straightening of the following road was presented to the Board:

Beginning at the  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner on south line of Sec. 11, T 15 S, R 18 E; thence north one mile and (Note: This petition is for the purpose of straightening the south 3/4 mile of old road No. 412, placing same symmetrical about the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. line and relocating the north  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile, placing same symmetrical about the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. line) terminating at the  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner on north line of Sec. 11, T 15 S, R 18 E.

Jas. F. Brass moved that the Brecheisen Road Petition be accepted and that the County Clerk advertise same in the official county paper, date of viewing set for 2:00 P. H., Wednesday May 10, 1939 in Marion Township. Chris Schaake seconded the motion. On vote, said motion carried by affirmative vote.

Final action on the two road petitions submitted to the Board on the 15th day of March and viewed on the 8th day of April; said road petitioned for by T. H. Hack et al, was taken this day for the closing of said roads for public use in Clinton Township. (All papers on file in the office of the County Engineer.)

Final action was taken on three road petitions presented by Oren Gwen et al.

Road No. 148 was ordered by the Board to be vacated. (Willow Springs Township) Road No. 122 was ordered by the Board to be vacated. Road No. 160 was ordered by the <sup>B</sup>oard to be vacated. (All records on above roads on file in the office of the County Engineer.)

Bids for a file for the office of the County Treasurer were opened at this time:

With all members present, the Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session, there being present, also, T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk.
