Two Commissioners of Douglas County, sitting as a Board, with the County Clerk, met in regular adjourned session in the regular meeting rooms at the courthouse. Commissioner Jas. F. Brass was absent this day because of his attendance of a Bindweed meeting at Hays.

The Board of County Commissioners convened at the hour of 9:30 A. M., for the purpose of resolving itself into a Board of Equalization to adjust any discrepancies that may have arisen during the 1939 assessment period. All the Commissioners, namely: Earl T. Black, Chairman, Jas. F. Brass and Chris Schaake, Commissioners and T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk were present.

Ers. W. O. Melson and Mrs. C. E. Pontius, representing the Lawrence Women's Club appeared before the Board in regard to getting the valuation of said club reduced from the total amount of \$12,185.00 to \$8000.00, which was the purchase price of the property. They contended that at a previous meeting last winter, the Commissioners had informed representatives of said club, that at the Equalization meeting at this time, the Board would consider favorably the reduction of the assessed valuation to the purchase price of \$8000.00. The minutes on the time in question, were referred to and showed no action as stated.
