May 20, 1939.

As a Board of Equalization, all Commissioners met this day in the regular meeting rooms of said Board. County Clerk T. R. Gerhart was present, also.

No Equalization matters coming before the Board, said Board adjourned to meet as a Board of County Commissioners.

Bids were received and opened for pillows to be furnished to the Jail. Charles Banning, the Sheriff, was present at the opening of these bids:

The Board of Equalization met this day to attend to assessment matters coming to its attention, there being present all members of said Board and the County Clerk.

Charles J. Simrock reported to the Board that he has been paying taxes on about 14 more acres of land than he actually owns. The deed on said tract calls for 53 acres, while a survey made showed that the tract contained only 44 acres. Said property is described as the SW 1/4 and S of S. 2. and Santa Fe RR, Palmyra Township, Sec. 33-14-20. On checking the map, it was discovered that Chas. E. Stephens, owner of adjacent property was not assessed with the total acreage of his property. This was taken under consideration, and the Board instructed the County Clerk to prepare data for adjustment.

Carl Perkins asked that a reduction in valuation be given on his property in Eudora Township (Description: F 109, 110 Outlot Book), located in Sec. 5-18-21, at the total amount of \$1160.00. He says there are about 80 lots in this tract, assessed at \$20.00 per lot. Mr. Perkins stated that he would be satisfied if the assessment was reduced to \$15.00 per lot.

The Board of Equalization adjourned to meet as a Board of County Commissioners. Whereupon, the Board went out to the Lone Star Park to inspect the fencing project.
