

A. E. RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on the 31st day of May, 1939, the same being a special meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, the application of E. C. Ransom for a beer license came on for consideration of said Board, and

WHEREAS, the Board does find that the said E. C. Ransom is in all ways qualified under the law to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on the premises, and

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that a due and legal notice has been given to the Grant Township Board, and that ten days have expired from the giving of said notice, and that no written objection has been filed by the Grant Township Board, protesting the granting of a beer license.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the applicant E. C. Ransom be granted a license to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on premises at the place so described in application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk of Douglas County, be, and he is hereby directed to issue said license.
