A majority of the members of the Board of County Commissioners, and the County Clerk met in regular adjourned session this 10th day of June, 1939.

Mrs. Chas. Brown, President of the Colored Women's Relief Corp. appeared before the Board in regard to securing a room in which this organization may hold its meetings, since it will be necessary that they vacate the room now occupied by them in the basement of the courthouse due to the fact that this is to be used for other purposes.

Hr. Prentice of the Kennedy Plumbing Company presented quotations to the Board on certain plumbing to be done in the Engineering department and the rooms which are to be occupied by the County Doctor. He quoted the approximate amount of \$19.00 for the lavatory in the Engineering Department; for the plumbing and gas fitting in the clinic rooms approximately \$35.00 plus \$4.50 for light fixture--with the additional cost of about \$16.00 if a sink is installed.

The following resolution was passed by the Board:

And have WHEREAS, on the 10th day of June, 1939, the same being a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, the application of C. F. Barncord for a beer license came on for consideration of said Board, and

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that a due and legal notice has been given to the Wakarusa Township Board, and that ten days have expired from the giving of said notice, and that no written objection has been filed by the Wakarusa Board, protesting the granting of a beer

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the applicant C. F. Barncord be granted a license to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on premises at the place so described in application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk of Douglas County, be and he is hereby directed to issue said license.
