The Board of County Commissioners, with all members and the County Clerk present, met in adjourned regular session.

Discussion was gone into with the Wakarusa Township Board and the County Engineer on a road petition which had been presented by Fred Jaedicke et al, for the location of a road described as: Beginning at a point about 653.07 feet north of the SW cor of the N $\frac{1}{2}$  of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 36, T 12 S, R 19 E; thence E parallel to the S line of N $\frac{1}{2}$  of said  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec., a distance of 990 feet, and terminating in the west end of a street in West Hills addition.

At this time, the Wakarusa Township Board was not in favor of the above road being located as described in the petition. The County Board took no action this day.

Discussion on the Judicial Tax Sale was gone into with the County Attorney. At this time, the following motion in regard to the services of Ernest Klooz, abstractor, was made.

It was moved by Jas. F. Brass that the services of Ernest Klooz, compiling data for the Judicial Tax Sale, be terminated in a reasonable length of time with all fairness to the tax payers and to himself. Chris Schaake seconded the motion. Said motion carried by unanimous vote.

The Board adjourned until Wednesday, June 28.

All members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk met in adjourned regular session.

Messrs. Jack Porter and Fred Stone spoke to the Board in the interest of Leon Frye for the position of Janitor at the courthouse.

Mr. Wendall Simons reported to the Commissioners that people were trespassing on his property to fish from a Government pond which is located on his place. The fish in the pond were put there by Mr. Simons. The Board suggested that he place signs on the property indicating no fishing allowed.

Clifton Ramsey with Mr. and Mrs. John E. Smith appeared before the Board to discuss the matter of the county securing title to certain land for park purposes, this land now the property of John E. Smith. The deed drawn up by Mr. Ramsey, which includes therein certain water rights, was read. Both Mr. and Mrs. Smith agreed to same, whereupon said deed was properly signed at this time.

FINAL ACTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON THE ROAD  
PETITIONED for by John Brecheisen and Others:

The petition of John Brecheisen and others for the alteration of a road being under consideration of the Board for final action, it is determined and ordered by the Board that the public good and convenience does not require the said road as viewed, located and surveyed be altered.

We determine and order the width of said road shall be 40 feet.

And it hereby so ordered by the Board and that these proceedings and the report of survey be recorded. It is also ordered that the Trustee of Marion Township be directed to cause the road opened for public use on the old right of way as originally laid out.
