At the hour of 8:30 A. M., the Douglas County Board of Commissioners, namely: Earl T. Black, Chairman, Jas. F. Brass and Chris Schaake, Commissioners, accompanied by Milton P. Beach, County Attorney, and Mildred LeSuer, County Budget Director, met in the offices of the Commission of Revenue and Taxation, Topeka, Kansas, for the purpose of studying appeals made to said Commission from property owners of Douglas, said appeals being made from the decisions rendered by the County Board.

At 1:30 P. M., the Board convened in the regular meeting rooms to discuss and work on the county budget with Mrs. LeSuer, Budget Director.

Chief of Police Jude Anderson and County Attorney Milton P. Beach met with the Board to discuss the hiring of a man to act as "Spy" on marihuana weed in this county. The seriousness of the existence of this weed was carefully gone into. The Board agreed that said man be hired at the wage of \$7.50 per day plus \$5.00 for expenses, to be paid only for the time actually spent in that capacity.

The Board adjourned to meet again Saturday, July 29 at 9 o'clock A. M.

In regular adjourned session at the hour of 9 o'clock A. M., all members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk met in regular meeting rooms of said Board.

Representatives of the Douglas County Sportsmen's Club, Lavene Vincent, President, Ernest Pontius, Vice-President and Fred W. Kahn, Secretary-Treasurer, met with the Commissioners for the purpose of discussing the closing of the Lone Star Lake for fishing. This is to prevent the depletion of the stock of fish placed in the lake, and the fishing in said lake will interfere with the work necessary to complete it and the park.

Whereupon, the following resolution was passed by motion of Chris Schaake, seconded by Jas. F. Brass and upon unanimous vote of all Commissioners:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it has been shown to The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that fishing at the Lone Star Lake, at the present time, will prevent the propagation of the stock of fish placed in the lake, and will interfere with the work necessary to complete the lake and park.

AND WHEREAS, the State Forestry, Fish and Game Commission refuses to stock the lake with more fish, as long as the public is allowed to fish at the said lake until it is officially opened.

AND WHEREAS, the said Forestry, Fish and Game Commission will assist the County of Douglas in patrolling the lake and preventing fishing therein, if the Board of County Commissioners close the lake and authorize the said Forestry, Fish and Game Commission to take jurisdiction on the lake and surrounding park.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that effective this date, fishing at the Lone Star County Lake shall be prohibited until the said lake is completed.
