The Sheriff presented explanations on certain bills presented to the Board from his department.

In regard to the itemization of certain bills of Dr. H. Penfield Jones, County Health Physician, the following action was taken: (Detailed minutes recorded in the Minute Book of Social Welfare).

It was moved by Jas. F. Brass that the Board instruct the County Attorney to write to the various wholesale houses, supplying drugs and supplies to the County Health Physician, for itemized accounts from January, 1938 to March, 1939, of purchases made by Dr. Jones, this being done with the permission of said Dr. Jones. Chris Schaake seconded the motion. On vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

Dr. H. Penfield Jones, in conversation with the Board and the County Attorney, on this matter this day, gave his consent to checking these account and expressed his willingness to cooperate with the County Attorney in making this investigation.

## September 9, 1939.

A majority of the members of the Board of County Commissioners, namely; Earl T. Black, Chairman and Chris Schaake, Commissioners, met in regular adjourned session, there being present, also, T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk.

Mr. Lindsay, Representative from Weaver's Department Store, demonstrated to the Board, a floor covering called Mastipave, in regard to the county's purchasing a floor covering for the doctor's office of the clinic rooms in the basement of the courthouse. The cost of covering said floor with this material would be about \$50.40; price of Mastipave is \$1.62 per sq. yd. No purchase was made this day.

For a discussion on the deeding of certain land by N.T. Veatch to the county, for park purposes, came said N. T. Veatch and Clifton Ramsey. Mr. Veatch refuses to give a deed to the county unless he receives some water rights. Mr. Veatch is desirous of having a well situated on his property. Until something can be done to adjust the situation as it now is, the county will be unable, to secure a deed to this certain property in order that it may be used for park purposes.

At this time, the following cancellation order was passed by the Board:
