All members of the Board of County Commissioners, namely: Earl T. Black, Chairman, Jas. F. Brass, and Chris Schaake, Commissioners and T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk met in adjourned regular meeting in the regular meeting rooms of said Board.

H. O. and O. D. Thomas, auctioneers, discussed with the Board the auctioneering of delinquent properties at the Judicial Tax Sale. After considerable discussion, and after the Board informed the Messrs. Thomas that $2\frac{1}{2}\%$, as stated in written bid by said auctioneers, would be in excess of what the county felt it could pay for said auctioneering, the brothers presented their offer of 1%. No decision was made this day.

Bids for a carload of lumber were opened at this time:

Specifications: All lumber must be of Douglas Fir, full sawn, and surfaced one side, and one edge (S1S1E) hit or miss, to uniform dimension of 2-15/16", by 11-15/16" and must conform to the grading requirements of The West Coast Lumber Men's Association for No. 1 dimension plank, Paragraph #195 page 33; and the density requirements of Paragraph 301 page 62.

It was moved by Jas. F. Brass that the Board accept the bid of the Wheeler Lumber Bridge & Supply Company for lumber as specified at the price of \$34.75 M, stated in bid opened this day, they being the low bidder. Chris Schaake seconded the motion. On vote, said motion unanimously carried.

Gene Glahn, Representative of the Manley Insurance Agency submitted his bid for insurance on the county cars. Said bid is on file in the office of the County Clerk.

In the presence of the two janitors and the janitress, duties for same were outlined by the Board and the County Clerk, and each was asked to abide by same.

With Glenn and Theodore Charlton, from insurance agency and with Roy Flory, Treasurer-elect, the Board, again, discussed bank depositories for public funds. Since the banks in Douglas County refused to cooperate by giving sufficient security for all deposits made by the county, the Board deemed it necessary to take the following action as stated in the following resolution:

RESOLUTION DESIGNATING BANK DEPOSITORIES FOR PUBLIC FUNDS

WHEREAS, the bond of Roy Flory, Treasurer-elect, of Douglas County, is now being accepted and approved, and

WHEREAS, as provided in Chapter 88, Session Laws of 1939, the Board of County Commissioners is given authority to designate bank depositories for public funds, with the provision that if satisfactory arrangements cannot be made with banks in county in which the deposit originates, depositories in other counties within the state may be designated, and

WHEREAS, a provision in Chapter 9-305 provides that in lieu of giving bond of depository, depository banks may deposit with the governing body of the municipality making such deposit, security amounting to 70% of the amount which may be on deposit therein by said municipality at any one time, and

WHEREAS, banks in Douglas County have failed to provide sufficient security for deposit of county funds amounting to 70% of the amount which may be on deposit therein by the County of Douglas, and

WHEREAS, Chapter 88, Session laws of 1939, provides that no bonds for security be required when such deposit is covered by insurance under provisions of the federal deposit insurance fund of the federal deposit insurance corporation.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, State of Kansas, in regular adjourned session this 4th day of October, 1939, that the following named banks insured under the F.D.I.C. be designated as depositories of public funds:
