Upon presentation of the bond of Roy Flory as Treasurer of Douglas County, Chris Schaake moved that the Board accept and approve said bond, same being in the amount of \$50,000.00. Jas. F. Erass seconded the motion. On vote, put by Chairman Earl T. Black, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

In regard to the speed limit on certain West Hills roads, the County Attorney reported to the Board, that the law states that the Board of County Commissioners can only set a speed limit at intersections, and that jurisdiction for establishing a speed limit at any other point lies with the State Highway Commission.

Paul Hopkins spoke to the Board in regard to the opening of a public well. The Commissioners informed him that they would have to check up on this.

Some discussion was gone into with the Sheriff in regard to the hiring of additional help during the Cornhusking Contest to be held in Douglas County on Movember 3, 1939. However, no action was taken on this.

After further consideration to insurance bids for county cars, as submitted by Gene Glahn from the Manley Insurance Agency and Dewey Schmittendorf, representative of the Western Insurance Company, it was moved by Chris Schmake that the Board accept the bid of the Western Insurance Company for the insuring of county cars, they being the low bidder. Seconded by Jas. F. Brass. On vote, motion carried unanimously. (Total \$325.71.)

It was decided by the Board that the necessary repairs to the Jail roof and to the roof of the Sheriff's dwelling be made by Wm. P. Kopp and J. T. Constant.
